Orbital vs. sub-orbital

- Totally different market paradigms
 - ➤ Basically piggy-backing with enormous infrastructure costs vs. adventure entertainment
- Real markets for the time being in sub-orbital
 - > Figures of Virgin Galactic
 - ➤ Simple technology simple benefits: weightlessness & viewing the earth

Virgin Galactic

- Key to impending success two-fold:
 - > No terrestrial launch but air launch
 - > Revolutionary design of the wings
- Combined manufacturing & service provision → special IPR company
 - ➤ Monopolisation vs. broad usage
- Aim SS-2: to prove technology!

Licensing

- Distinction licensing-authorisation
- Of course still matter of nat'l law
 - ➤ Airline(-like) licensing...?
 - N.B.: Virgin Galactic UK company
- Dealing with liability-reimbursement ref. Liability Convention
- Licenses also have value in terms of securities! (UNIDROIT)

Registration

- Main issue: a/c or s/o?
 - ➤ SS-2 t/b registered in US as space object plus launch facility but complying with aviation standards as for certification!
 - → International registration should be under Registration Convention…?
- Registration of Russian a/c...

Liability

- Air law liability would be more appropriate for passengers
 - Medical issues!
 - ➤ Third-party liability: if space objects (SS-2!), Liability Convention applies → national law!?
- Liability: will waivers be upheld?
- Product liability for manufacturers
- Insurance: just starting to move in...

Certification

- Constraints may severely negatively impact
 - > Cf. US currently; Europe needs to address
- Crew certification has not been addressed today
- 'Certification' passengers
 - Virgin Galactic: 16+ years; pregnancy; heart
 & circulatory issues (←→ astronauts!)

Financing

- UNIDROIT efforts to stimulate developing financial markets – might well include developing markets such as space tourism!
 - ➤ Cf. Virgin Galactic's SS-3

Int'l legal issues

- ■Boundary air-outer space!
 - > Are flights in air or in outer space?
 - > NASA: 50 m/80 km; X-prize: 100 km
 - > Achilleas: 110 km
- Liability UAE / Singapore ...?
- FAA ISFO idea: institutional issues
- Status of crew & passengers...
 - ➤ Astronauts not legal status! → int'l statute?
